

## What is a TRA?

- (i) TRA stands for Tenants and Residents Association.
- ilt is a community group made up of local people acting in a voluntary capacity to promote and defend the interests of tenants and residents in their area.
- (i) Being part of a TRA group enables areas to have a **representative voice** and increase the **sense of belonging** to a **community**.
- (i) It is also something that provides a **collective voice** for tenants and residents in an area, and acts as a **focus for consultation** and an organisation to **lobby for changes**. It can be a place to campaign on certain issues e.g. better **play facilities** and **improvements** to the area.
- ① A group can also be a base to develop extra services through self help schemes e.g. coffee mornings, lunch clubs and warm hubs.

## How do I know if there is a TRA active in my area?
